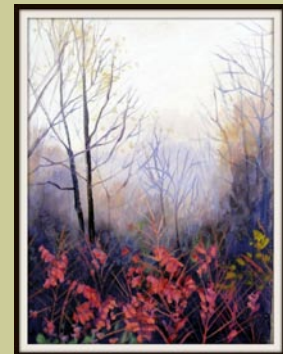

FRIENDS Spring Viewshed Planting Blue Ridge Parkway Site Chosen



FRIENDS of the Blue Ridge Parkway Roanoke Valley Chapter is sponsoring a viewshed planting on March 20, 2010 at Milepost 104.9. This location was chosen by National Park Service Landscape Architect David Anderson.

The site is just north of the N&W Railroad Overlook on the Blue Ridge Parkway outside of Vinton, VA.

Volunteers will be planting 300 seedlings along the Parkway's boundaries. Once mature, the

seedlings will serve as a natural buffer between the Parkway and nearby development.

Blue Ridge Marathon on the Parkway Inaugural Marathon to be Held in April

The inaugural running of the Blue Ridge Marathon on the Parkway coincides with the Parkway's 75th Anniversary. It will begin and end in downtown Roanoke, VA on April 24, 2010. All proceeds from the marathon will benefit FRIENDS of the Blue Ridge Parkway. The marathon website lists the following details:

- **Honorary Race Chair:** Rep. Bob Goodlatte (VA)

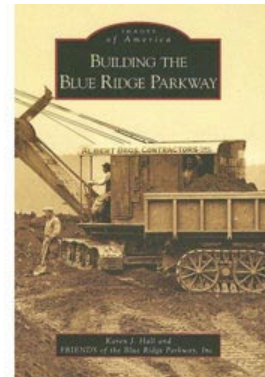

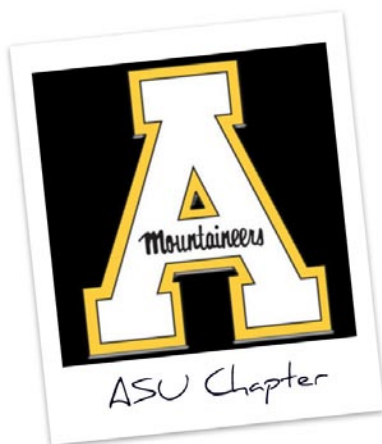
West Jefferson Chapter

Legislation to Preserve Parkway Introduced

NC & VA Senators Join in Effort



To commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Blue Ridge Parkway, U.S. Senators Jim Webb (D-VA) and Mark Warner (D-VA) have joined North Carolina Senators Kay R. Hagan (D-NC) and Richard Burr (R-NC) to introduce legislation authorizing the National Park Service to acquire up to 50,000 acres of land surrounding the historic roadway.

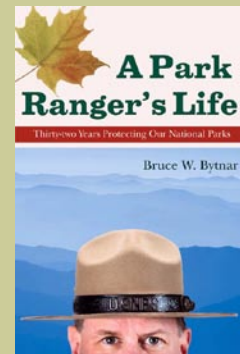
The Blue Ridge Parkway Protection Act will authorize \$75 million over five years to allow the National Park Service to acquire and preserve high priority land surrounding the Blue Ridge Parkway. The bill will adjust the Parkway's boundary to include the new land acquisition, but no land would be acquired through eminent domain. [continue reading](#)

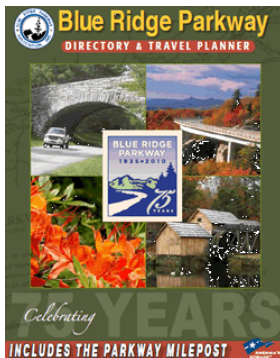

Parkway Volunteers Honored *Plateau VIPs of the Year*

A volunteer team consisting of two grandparents and their grandson made up the 2009 Volunteer In Parks (VIP) award winners in the Plateau District. J.C. and Linda Barton, along with their grandson Nicholas, logged 1,363 hours of volunteer service in 2009.

The team performed various maintenance tasks in addition to conducting monthly fire extinguisher checks, helping to open and close snow gates and hauling recyclable material. They were also responsible for locating and cleaning up a tire dump consisting of 96 tires that had been left on Parkway land. J.C. was also responsible for finding an abandoned well that was open and posed an extreme safety hazard. In addition to all of



this, the Bartons also served as campground hosts for the second year.

According to Mindy DeCesar, Plateau District Interpretive Supervisor, this volunteer team always went "above and beyond the normal limits of all tasks assigned." She adds that "the value of the services these individuals performed is practically immeasurable."
